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SECTION 1 SAFETY

1.1 Safety Symbols

1.2 Installation and Maintenance



DANGER! Make sure all electrical installation, service and/or maintenance work is performed by a qualified electrician and is in accordance with applicable electrical codes..

DANGER! Before performing any service to this equipment, turn the power toggle switch to the OFF position and disconnect the sawmill battery ground terminal.



WARNING! Before replacing the debarker blade, move the sawmill blade guide arm in front of the sawmill blade to cover the blade teeth.

1.3 Operation and Towing



DANGER! Make sure all guards and covers are in place and secured before operating the debarker option.

DANGER! Keep all persons out of the path of moving equipment when operating the debarker.



WARNING! Debarker is ON when warning light is ON (or bell sounds prior to Rev. A.07). DO NOT disconnect the warning light (or bell).

SECTION 2 DEBARKER INSTALLATION

The debarker option may be installed only to LT35 and LT35HD sawmills Rev. A4.00 and newer equipped with the new up/down system.



DANGER! Before performing any service to this equipment, turn the power toggle switch to the OFF position and disconnect the sawmill battery ground terminal. Failure to do so will result in serious injury or death.



CAUTION! Due to various design changes and past retrofits and options, you should very carefully look your mill over to determine Debarker compatibility before beginning Debarker installation.

2.1 Debarker Installation



DANGER! Always disengage the blade and shut off the sawmill engine before installing the debarker. Failure to do so will result in serious injury.

IMPORTANT! Sawmills are equipped with pre-drilled Debarker mounting holes. **Verify hole locations before beginning Debarker installation. Proper hole location is imperative for safe and effective Debarker operation.**

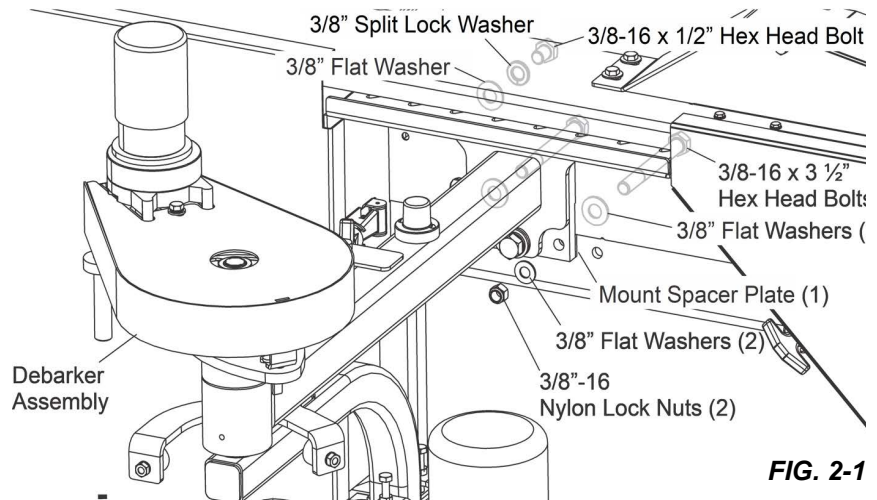

7. Assemble the debarker assembly to the sawmill saw head. **See Fig. 2-1.**
8. Align the debarker mounting plate holes and the mounting holes in the saw head.
9. Use the provided mount spacer plate and fasteners to secure in place as shown below.
10. Make sure the debarker is square to the saw head before tightening.
11. Install the solenoid/breaker box to the saw head frame.
12. Use the two provided 1/4-20 x 3/4" hex head bolts, 1/4" split lock washers and 1/4" flat washers to secure the solenoid/breaker box to the water bottle mount bracket.

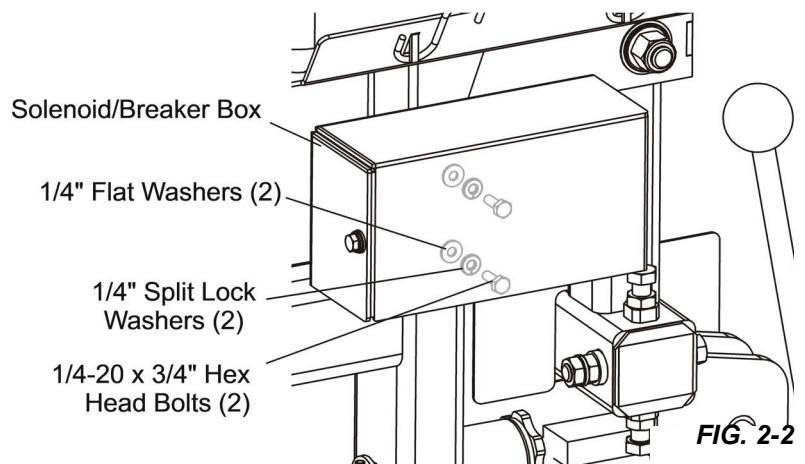

2.2 Harness Installation



DANGER! Before performing any service to this equipment, turn the power toggle switch to the OFF position and disconnect the sawmill battery ground terminal. Failure to do so will result in serious injury or death.

NOTICE Avoid pinch and pivot points, unnecessary wire bending and open spaces where the wire could get caught by a log, etc. If you have any questions, call Wood-Mizer customer service.

1. Route the debarker motor harness through the saw head frame hole.

2. Continue routing the debarker motor harness inside the debarker frame towards the debarker blade guide arm motor and blade motor as shown below.

3. Connect the blade guide arm motor wires to the blade guide arm motor.

4. Remove the top motor cover from the blade motor and remove the top nuts from each of the blade motor terminals.

5. Route the black motor and light wires (or bell wires prior to **Rev. A.07**) through one of the provided rubber boots.

Prior to Rev. A.07: Strip the end of the black warning bell wire and install a 1/4" 14-16 gauge ring terminal. To install the 14-16 gauge ring terminal, fold the stripped end of the wire over the insulation, install the ring terminal and crimp in place.

6. Connect the black motor and light wires (or bell wires prior to **Rev. A.07**) to the negative (-) motor terminal.

7. Replace the terminal nut to secure the wires.

NOTE: Make sure that the ring terminals do not touch the motor body.

8. Route the red motor and light wires (or bell wires prior to **Rev. A.07**) through one of the provided rubber boots.

Prior to Rev. A.07: Strip the end of the red warning bell wire and install a 1/4" 14-16 gauge ring terminal. To install the 14-16 gauge ring terminal, fold the stripped end of the wire over the insulation, install the ring terminal and crimp in place.

9. Connect the red motor and light wires (or bell wires prior to **Rev. A.07**) to the positive (+) motor terminal. Replace the terminal nut to secure the wires.

NOTE: Make sure that the ring terminals do not touch the motor body.

10. Slide the rubber boots over the motor terminal posts to protect the connections.

11. Replace the top motor cover.

12. Remove the cover from the solenoid/breaker box, if necessary.

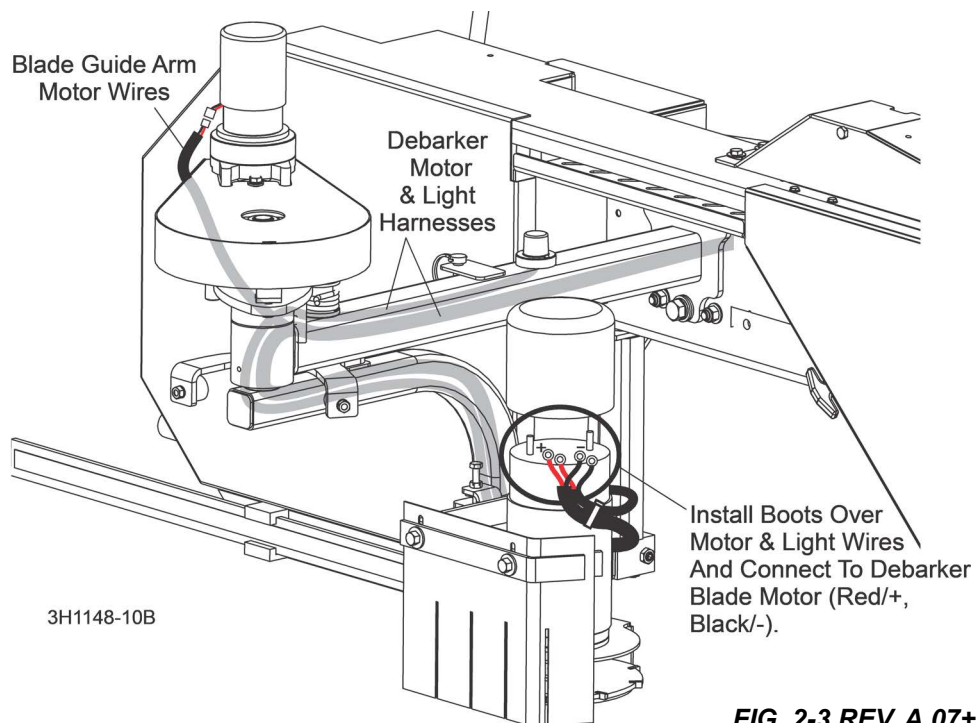


FIG. 2-3 REV. A.07+

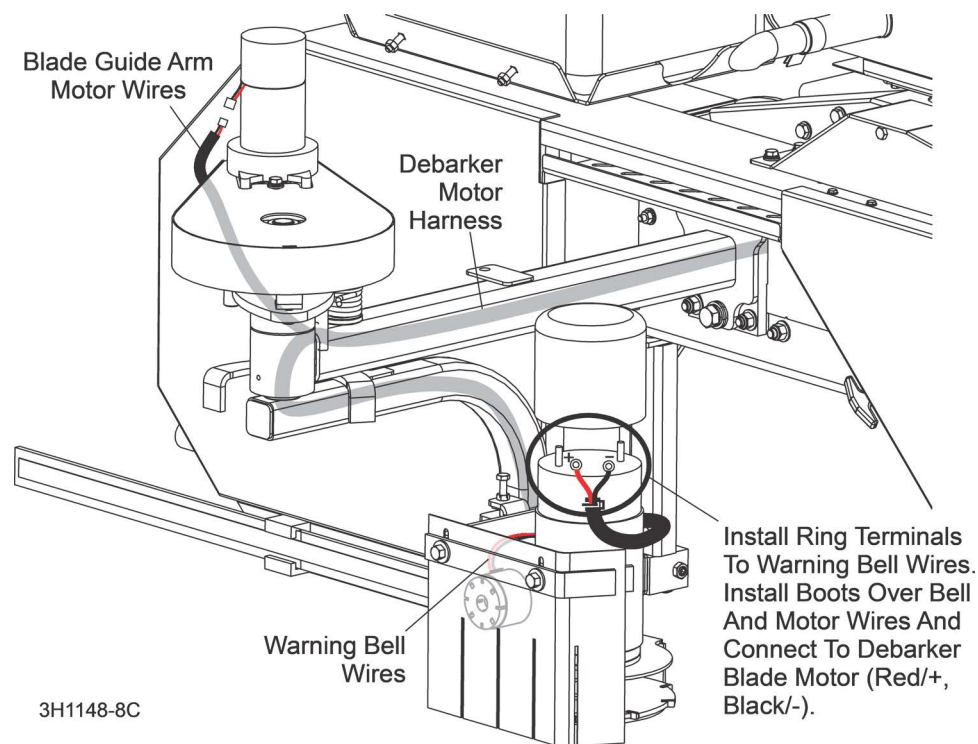


FIG. 2-4 PRIOR TO REV. A.07

13. Connect the debarker motor red wire to terminal #2 of the solenoid in the solenoid/breaker box.
14. Connect the debarker motor black wire to the alternator ground stud.
15. Locate the control box red wire with the ring terminal bundled with the existing harnesses next to the alternator.
16. Connect the control box red wire to terminal #3 of the solenoid in the solenoid/breaker box.
17. Connect one end of the supplied 20" red wire to the top terminal of the breaker in the solenoid/breaker box. **See Fig. 2-5.**

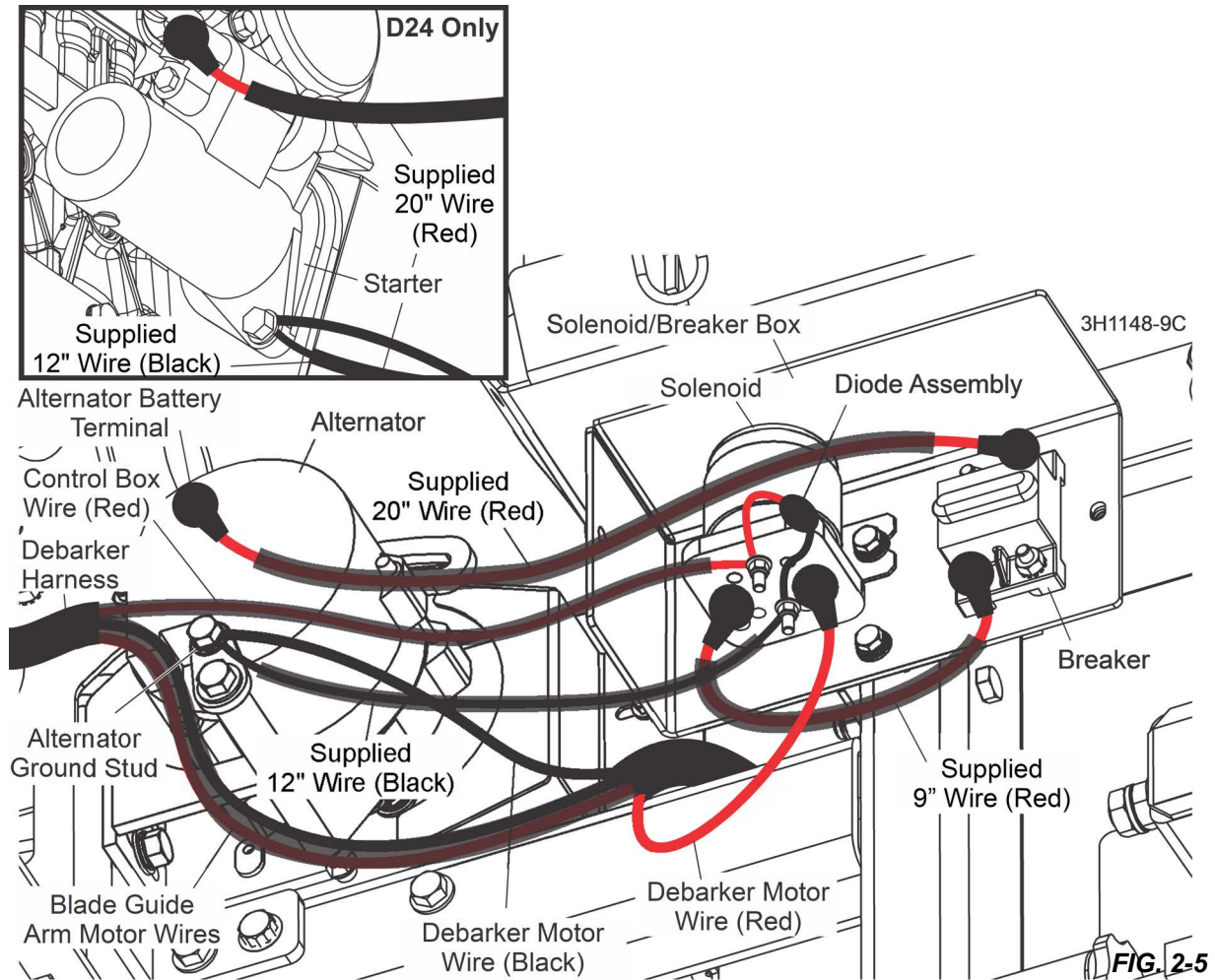

18. Connect the other end of the supplied 20" red wire to the battery terminal located on the alternator.
D24 Only: Connect the other end of the supplied 20" red wire to the battery terminal located on the starter.
19. Connect one end of the supplied 12" black wire to terminal #4 of the solenoid in the solenoid/breaker box.
20. Connect the other end of the supplied 12" black wire to the alternator ground stud.
D24 Only: Connect the other end of the supplied 12" black wire to the starter ground stud.
21. Connect one end of the supplied 9" red wire to terminal #1 of the solenoid in the solenoid/breaker box (if not already connected).
22. Connect the other end of the supplied 9" red wire to the bottom post of the 60 Amp breaker.
23. Connect the diode assembly to the solenoid in the solenoid/breaker box.
24. Connect the red wire of the diode assembly to terminal #3 of the solenoid.
25. Connect the black wire of the diode assembly to terminal #4 of the solenoid.
26. Replace the solenoid/breaker box cover and use the tie wraps to secure all the wires to the existing harnesses.

2.3 Control Component Installation



DANGER! Before performing any service to this equipment, turn the power toggle switch to the OFF position and disconnect the sawmill battery ground terminal. Failure to do so will result in serious injury or death.

See [SECTION 4](#) for the appropriate wiring diagram to aid in installation.

1. Remove the front panel (leave wire connections) from the control box.
2. Using the back side of the front panel for a guideline, cut out holes in the front panel lexan decal for the debarker on/off and in/out switches.
3. Install the provided debarker on/off and in/out switches, 1/16" nylon washers, and rubber boots in place as shown. See Fig. 2-6.

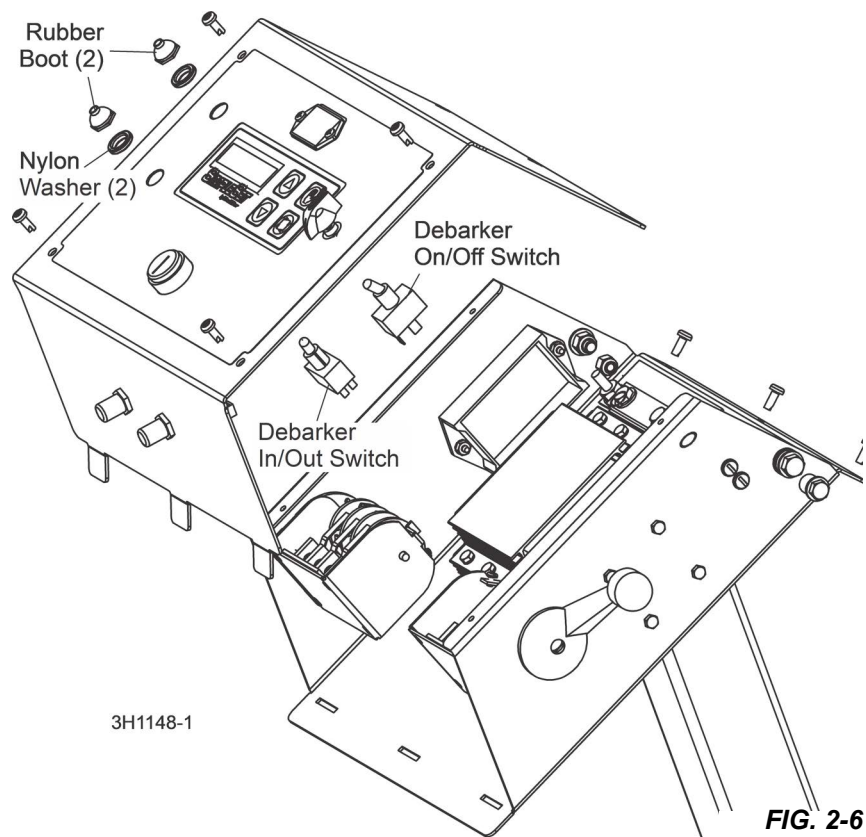

4. See Fig. 2-7. Connect the red wire from the AUX post of the circuit breaker CB1 to the top terminal on the debarker on/off switch.
5. Connect the red wire labeled "3" from the debarker harness to the bottom terminal on the debarker on/off switch.
6. Connect the black wire labeled "4" from the debarker harness to the top middle terminal on the debarker in/out switch.
7. Connect the red wire labeled "5" from the debarker harness to the bottom middle terminal on the debarker in/out switch.
8. Connect the red wire from the AUX post of the circuit breaker CB2 to the top end terminal on the debarker in/out switch.
9. Connect the black wire from the ground stud to the bottom end terminal on the debarker in/out switch.

Only wires referred to here are shown.

10. Reinstall the front panel to the control box.

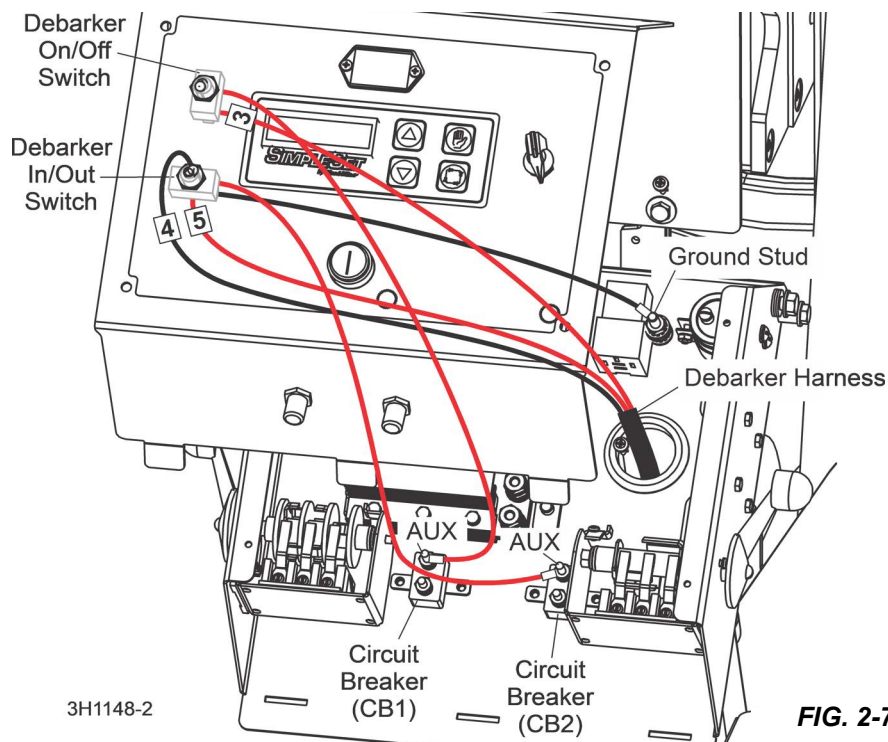

SECTION 3 ALIGNMENT



DANGER! Before performing any service to this equipment, turn the power toggle switch to the OFF position and disconnect the sawmill battery ground terminal. Failure to do so will result in serious injury or death.

The debarker blade must be aligned to the sawmill blade to insure proper operation. The debarker blade operates parallel with and aligned vertically with the sawmill blade.

1. Use the debarker in/out switch to move the debarker all the way in.
2. Turn the power toggle switch to OFF (0) and lock the control box, to prevent the debarker from being turned on while performing alignment procedures.
3. Check the squareness of the debarker with the sawmill blade.
4. Adjust the debarker mounts if necessary until the debarker is square with the sawmill blade. **See Fig. 3-1.**
5. Loosen the debarker mounting bolts.
6. Tilt the debarker frame as necessary until the debarker is square with the sawmill blade.
7. Retighten the mounting bolts.
8. Clip the blade guide alignment tool to the sawmill blade. **See Fig. 3-2.**
9. Make sure the tool lies flat on the blade and does not contact a tooth that could cause it to angle.
10. Check the height of the debarker blade against the alignment tool.

The bottom edge of the tool should align with the center of the debarker blade.

- a. Adjust the blade up or down by loosening the four blade motor mount bolts.
- b. Loosen the jam nut on the adjustment bolt.
- c. Turn the adjustment bolt clockwise to push the motor and blade down.
- d. Turn the adjustment bolt counterclockwise and slide the motor up to raise the motor and blade.
- e. Retighten the adjustment bolt jam nut and four motor mount bolts.

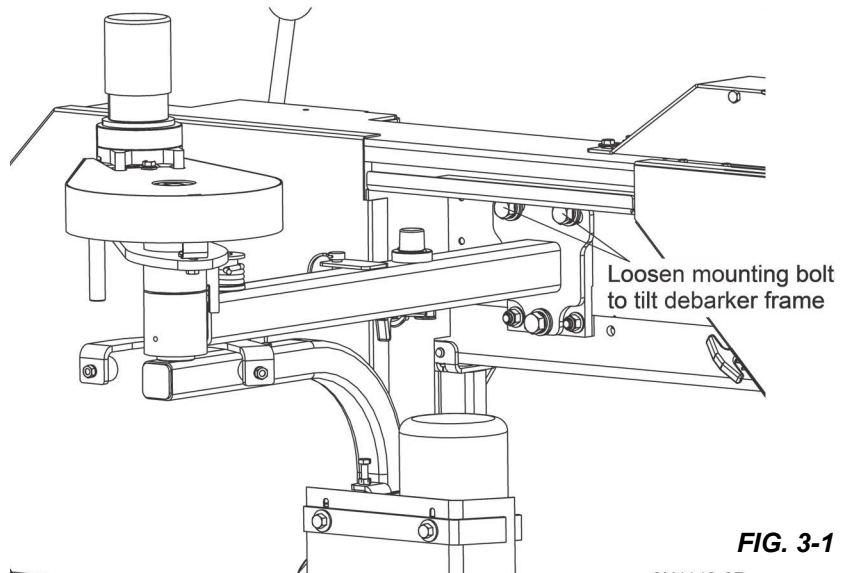

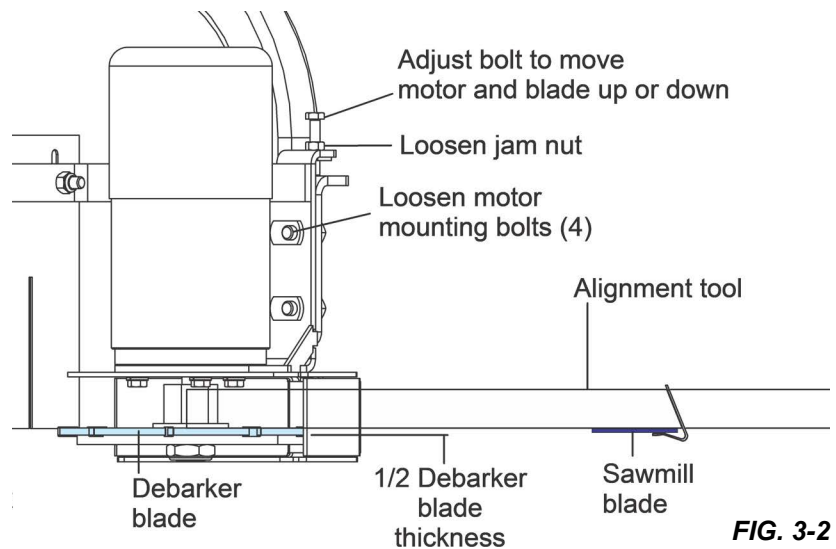

11. Use the debarker in/out switch to move the debarker all the way out.
12. Move the blade guide alignment tool on the sawmill blade and check the position of the debarker blade against the tool.
13. Readjust the debarker mounting bolts until the debarker assembly parallel to the blade.

SECTION 4 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

4.1 Locking Pin Operation

The debarker is equipped with a locking pin. Insert the locking pin to lock the debarker in place when towing the sawmill. Remove the locking pin to unlock the debarker while the debarking is required during sawing.

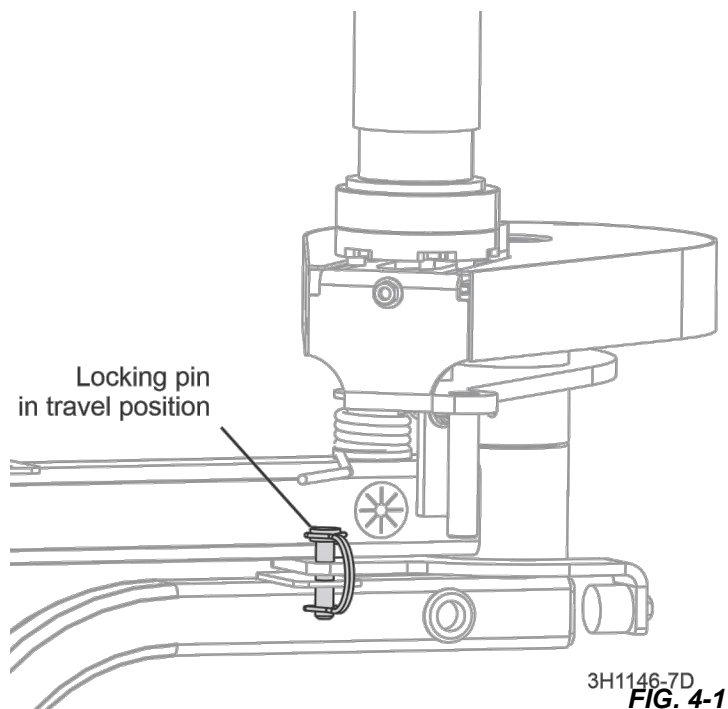
BEFORE OPERATION

1. Make sure the locking pin is removed from its travel position.
2. Turn the power toggle switch to OFF (0).
3. Pull the debarker out to relieve pressure on the locking pin.
4. Remove the locking pin.

BEFORE TOWING

1. Lock the debarker in the travel position.
2. Use the debarker in/out switch to move the debarker all the way in.
3. Push the debarker in until the travel position holes align.
4. Insert the locking pin.

To move the debarker out of the way during sawing, use the debarker in/out switch to move the debarker all the way out.



4.2 Control Overview

The Debarker Option allows you to remove bark from logs ahead of the bandsaw blade. This prevents the bandsaw blade from contacting dirt, sand, or other debris in the bark that can dull the blade.

The debarker control includes two toggle switches.

BLADE MOTOR ON/OFF TOGGLE SWITCH

Turns the blade motor on to start the debarker blade. The sawmill power toggle switch must be on and the sawmill power feed joystick must be activated in the forward direction before the blade motor can be turned on.

DEBARKER IN/OUT SWITCH

Moves the debarker cutting head toward or away from the log.

4.3 Operation



DANGER! Make sure all guards and covers are in place and secured before operating the debarker option. Failure to do so may result in serious injury.

DANGER! Keep all persons out of the path of moving equipment when operating the debarker. Failure to do so will result in serious injury.

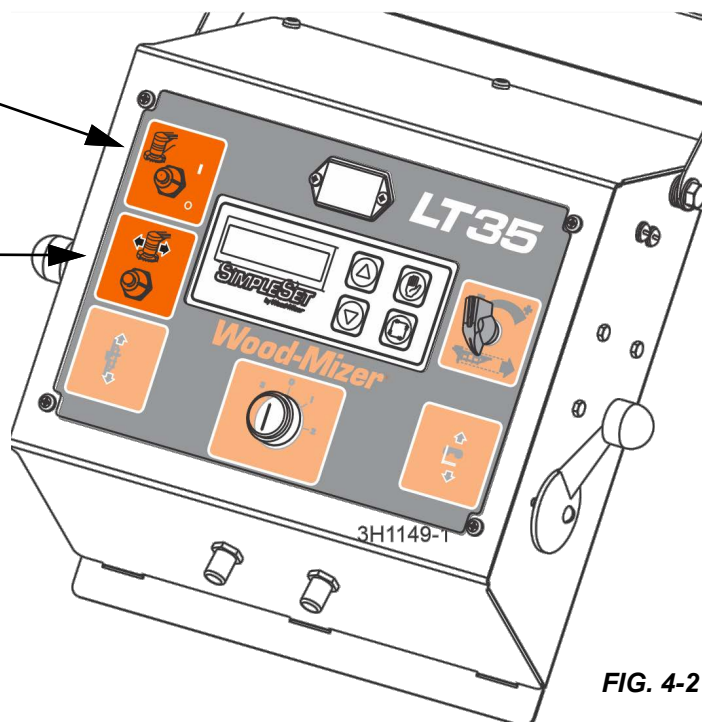

1. Make sure the warning light is on (or bell sounds prior to Rev. A.07) when the debarker is turned on.



WARNING! Debarker is ON when warning light is ON (or bell sounds (prior to Rev. A.07)). DO NOT disconnect the warning light (or bell). Doing so may result in serious injury.

2. Use the in/out switch to pivot the debarker all the way out.
3. Move the sawmill carriage forward and pivot the debarker in until the debarker blade engages with the end/side of the log.
4. Turn the debarker on/off switch to ON (1).
5. Proceed with cutting. The in/out switch will keep the debarker against the side of the log. Depending on log shape, you may have to pivot the debarker in and out for smooth cutting.

NOTE: The debarker can continuously remove up to approximately 1" of material from the log; no motor cool down time is required. Slower feed rates may be required for optimal debarker operation.

6. Once the carriage is past the end of the log, pivot the debarker away from the log. Return the carriage.

NOTE: Always remember to pivot the debarker out of the way of the log before returning the carriage after the cut. **DO NOT** move the carriage forward while the debarker is contacting the log without the blade spinning.

7. When done sawing and ready to store or transport the sawmill, place the debarker in its travel position before towing the sawmill ([See Section 4.1](#)).

4.4 Maintenance



WARNING! Before performing any service to this equipment, turn the power toggle switch to the OFF position and disconnect the sawmill battery ground terminal. Failure to do so will result in serious injury or death.

1. Periodically check the flexible guard. Replace the guard as needed.
2. Periodically check the debarker blade. Align or replace as needed.



WARNING! Before replacing the debarker blade, move the sawmill blade guide arm in front of the sawmill blade to cover the blade teeth.

BLADE REPLACEMENT

1. Place one wrench on the blade holder bushing, above the blade.
2. Place the other wrench on the lower hex nut.
3. Remove the hex nut and washer.
4. Remove the blade and washer.
5. Reinstall the washer with the new blade.
6. Reinstall the hex nut and washer and **tighten to 35 foot-pounds (±5)**.



CAUTION! Tighten the blade hex nut manually. Using power-assisted tools may result in over-torquing and damage to the bolt.

4.5 Troubleshooting



DANGER! Before performing any service to this equipment, turn the power toggle switch to the OFF position and disconnect the sawmill battery ground terminal. Failure to do so will result in serious injury or death.

PROBLEM	CAUSE	SOLUTION
Circuit breaker tripping	Wood or bark jammed in blade guard	Turn power toggle switch to OFF position. Remove wood or bark from blade guard
	Circuit breaker weak from repeated tripping.	Replace circuit breaker
Light comes on, but debarker motor and warning light (or horn prior to Rev. A.07) do not operate	Circuit breaker tripped	Reset circuit breaker.
Debarker shuts off, but the circuit breaker is not tripped.	Loose wiring connection	Check wiring connections inside control box.
Debarker will not shut off.	Solenoid is stuck closed.	Replace solenoid.

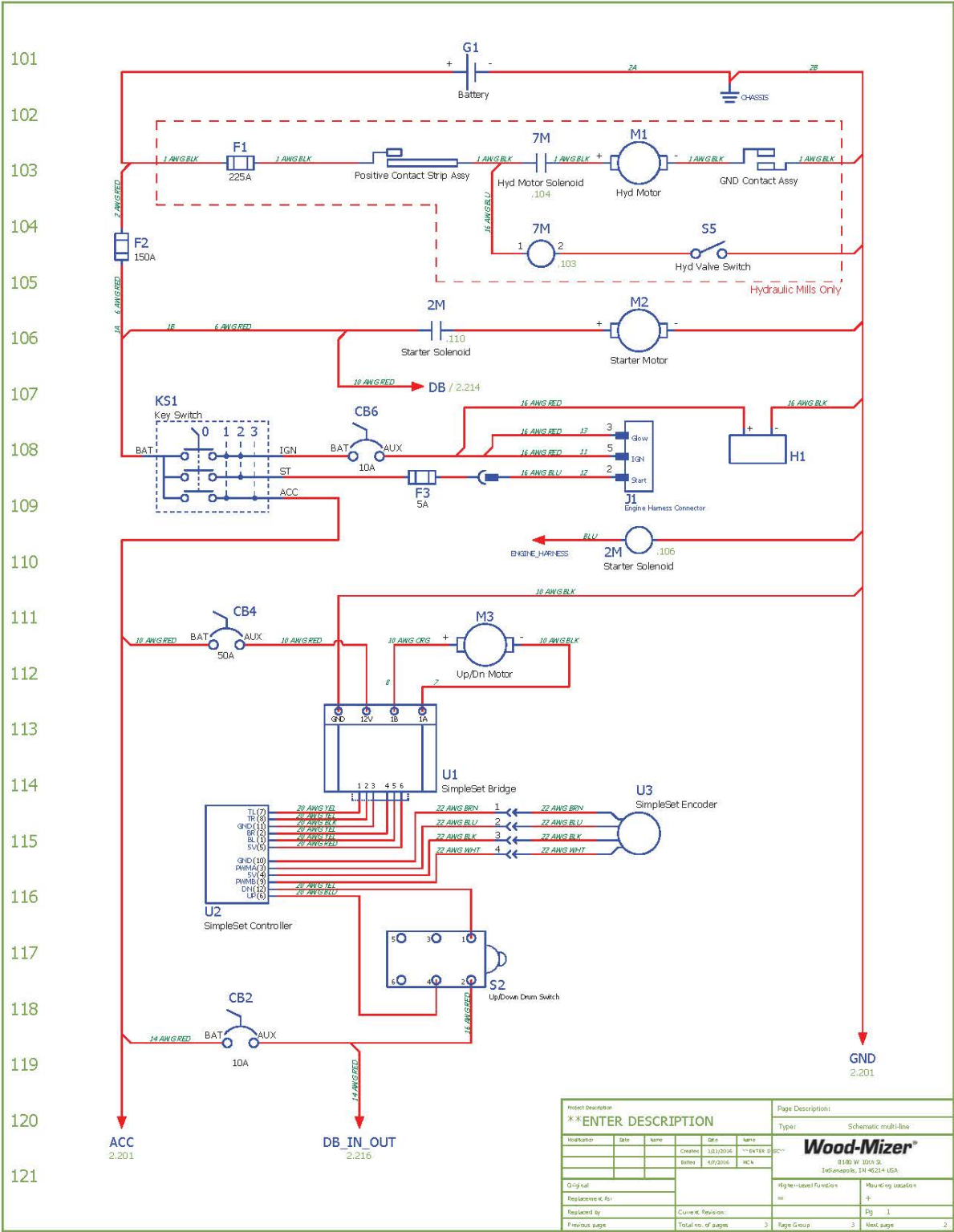


FIG. 5-1 PAGE 1 OF 2

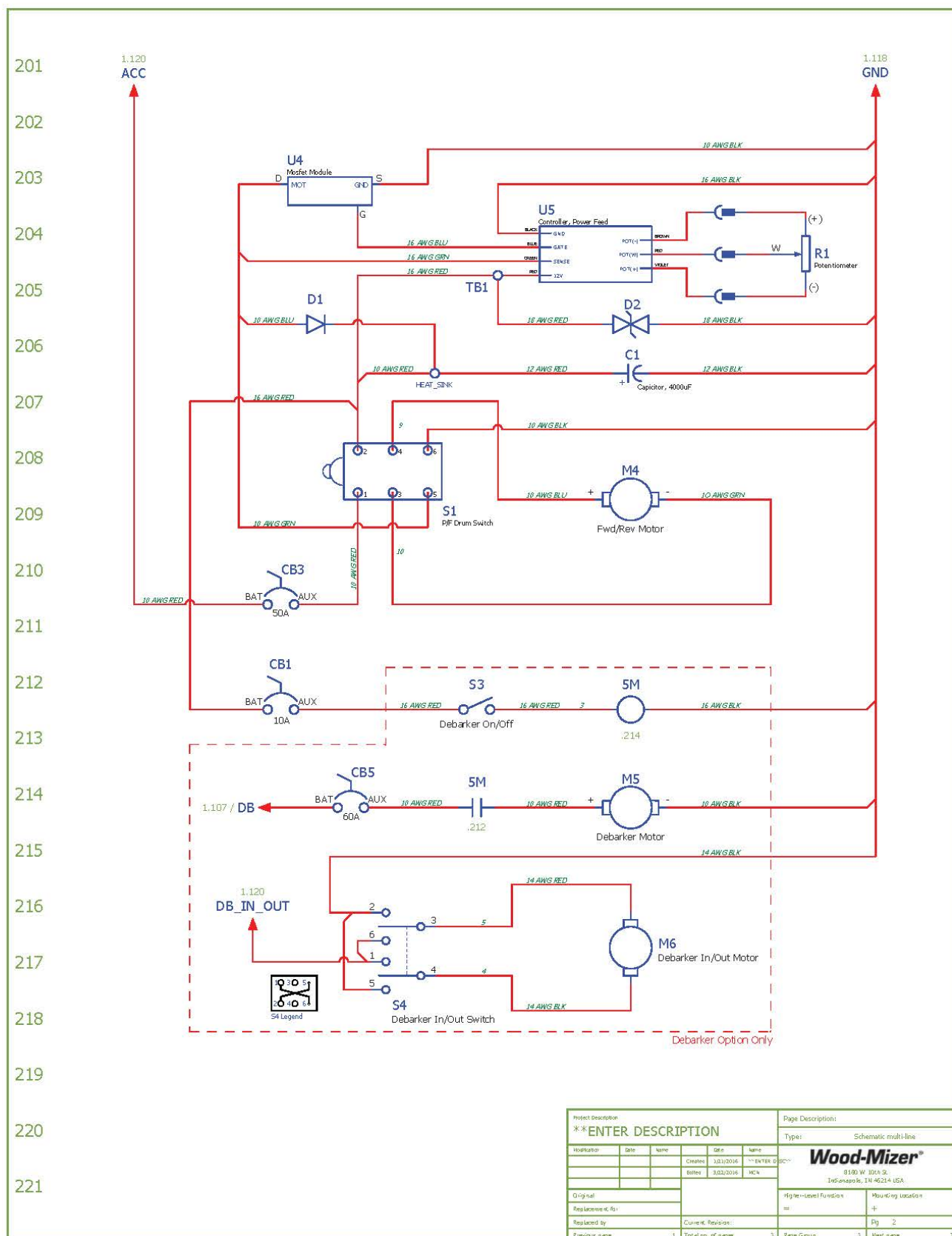


FIG. 5-2 PAGE 2 OF 2

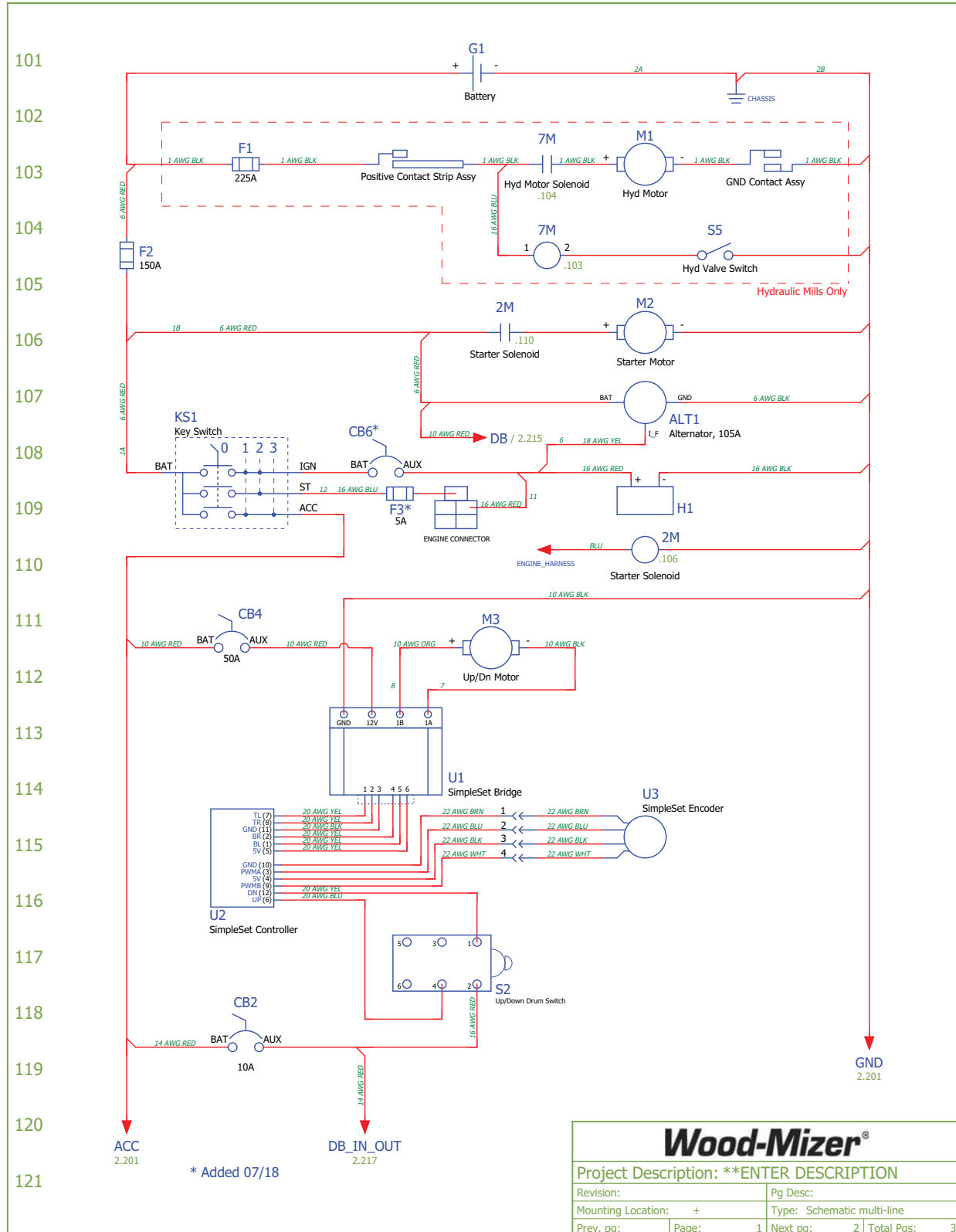


FIG. 5-3 PAGE 1 OF 2

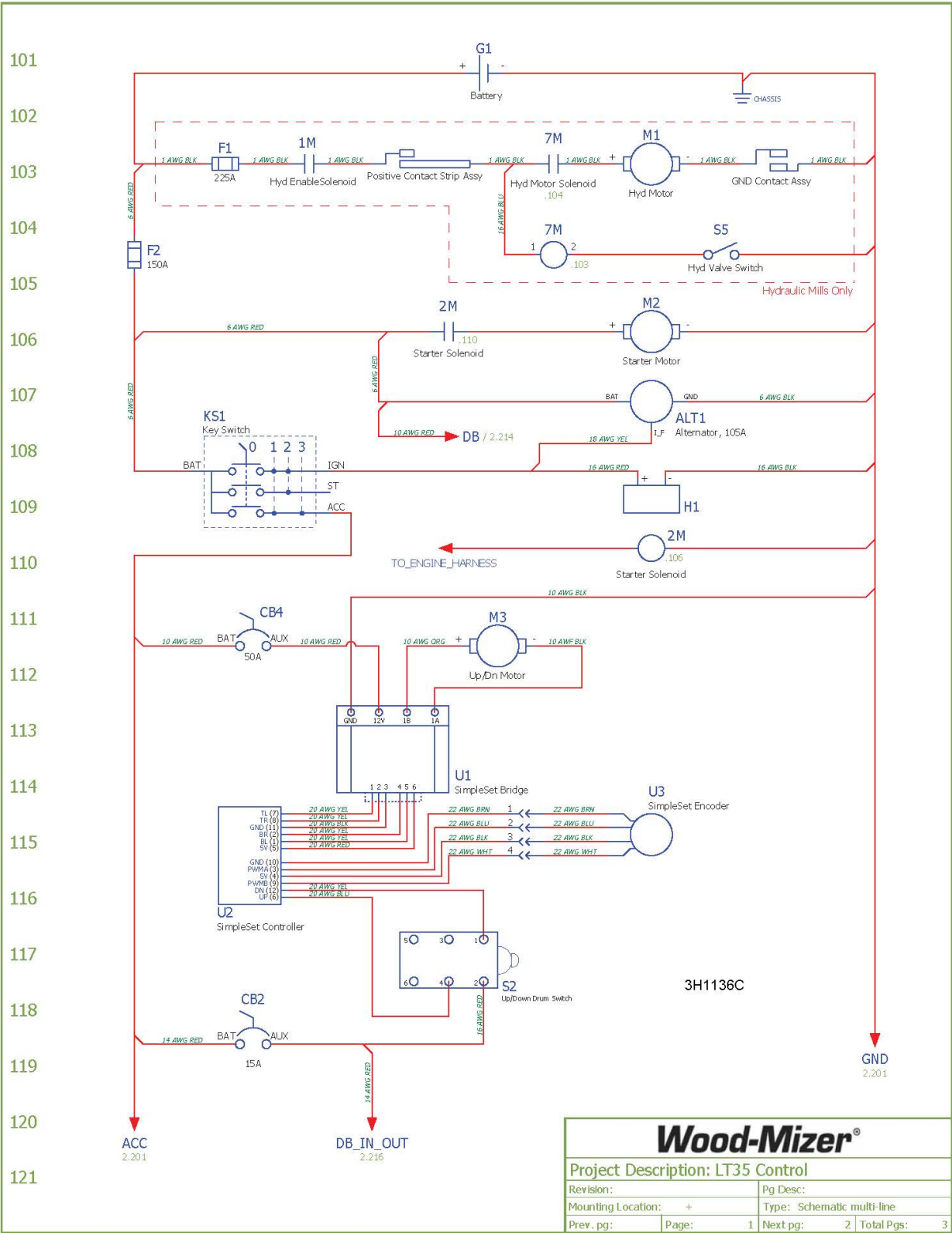


FIG. 5-5 PAGE 1 OF 2

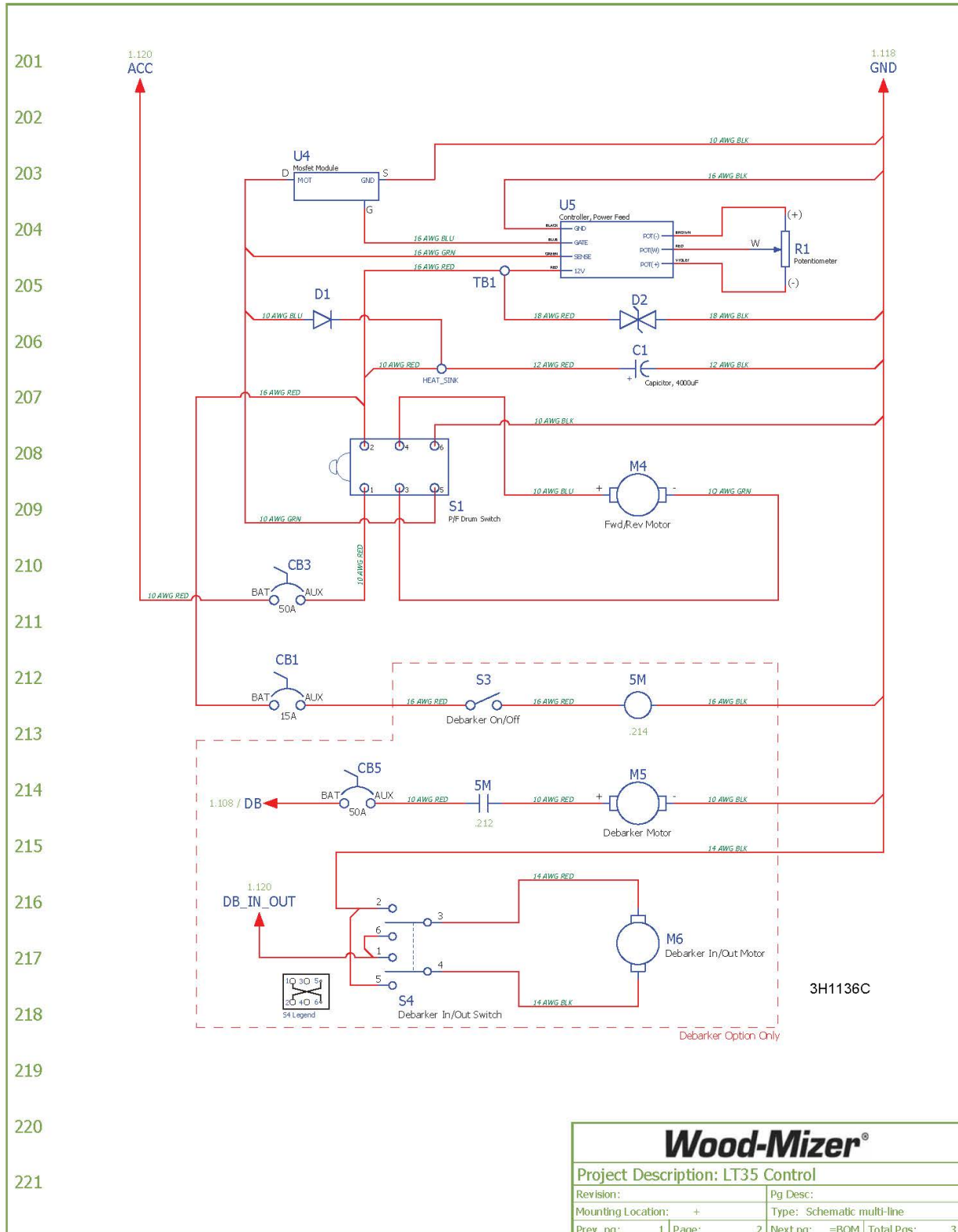


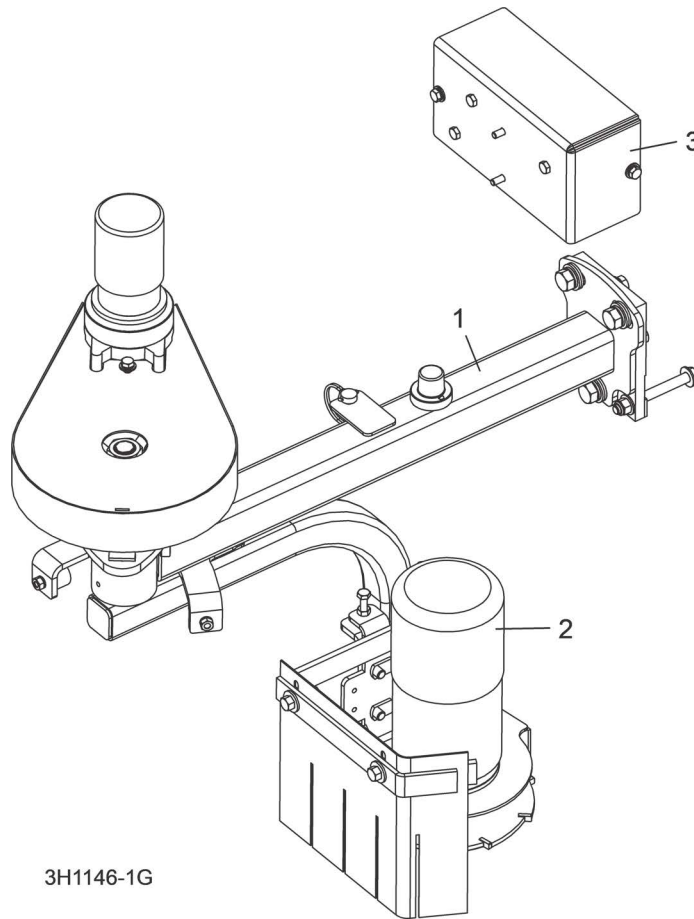
FIG. 5-6 PAGE 2 OF 2
