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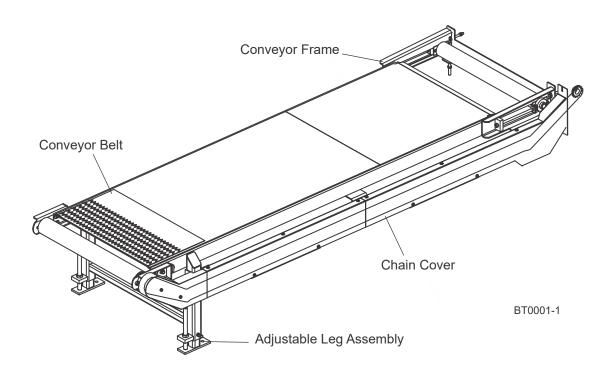

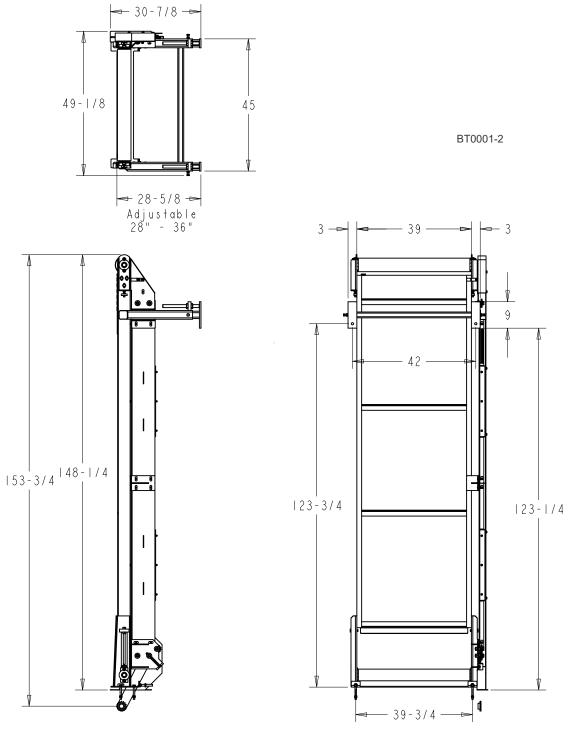

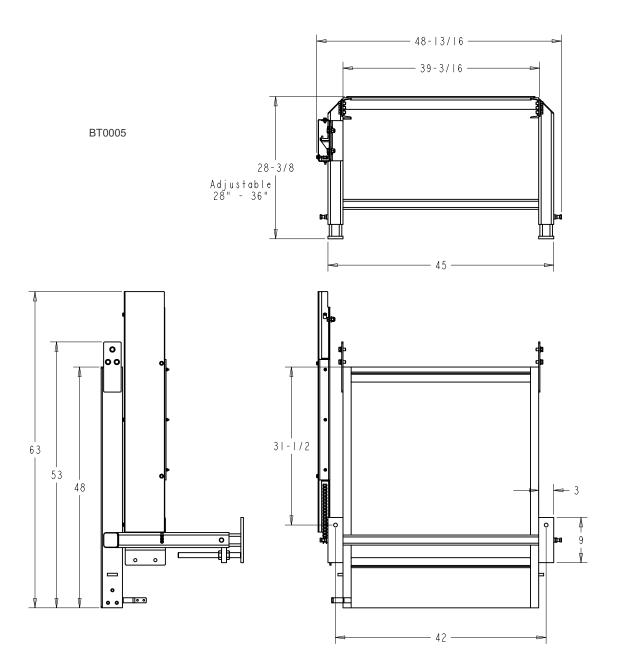

# **SECTION 2 SAFETY**

### 2.1 Safety Symbols

Also read any additional manufacturer's manuals and observe any applicable safety instructions including dangers, warnings, and cautions.

Only persons who have read and understood the entire operator's manual should operate the Conveyor. The Conveyor is not intended for use by or around children.

**IMPORTANT!** It is always the owner's responsibility to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations regarding the ownership and operation of your Conveyor. All owners are encouraged to become thoroughly familiar with these applicable laws and comply with them fully while using the Conveyor.



#### SETUP

WARNING! Use extreme care and proper equipment to lift and move the Conveyor. Lift under the base of the machine only. Failure to do so may result in personal injury and/or machine damage.

#### WEAR SAFETY CLOTHING



**WARNING!** Secure all loose clothing and jewelry before operating the Conveyor. Failure to do so may result in serious injury or death.

**WARNING!** Always wear eye, ear, respiration, and foot protection when operating or servicing the Conveyor.

#### KEEP CONVEYOR AND AREA AROUND CON-VEYOR CLEAN



DANGER! Maintain a clean and clear path for all necessary movement around the Conveyor and lumber

stacking areas. Failure to do so will result in serious injury.

#### DISPOSE OF SAWING BY-PRODUCTS PROPERLY



**WARNING!** Clean sawdust from all guards, vents, control boxes, or any area where sawdust may gather after every shift. Failure to do so may result in fire, causing death or serious injury.





**IMPORTANT!** Always properly dispose of all sawing by-products, including sawdust and other debris, coolant, oil, fuel, oil filters and fuel filters.

#### CHECK CONVEYOR BEFORE OPERATION

**DANGER!** Make sure all guards and covers are in place and secured before operating the Conveyor. Failure to do so may result in serious injury.



**WARNING!** Do not for any reason adjust the drive chains with the machine running. Doing so may result in serious injury.

#### **KEEP PERSONS AWAY**



**DANGER!** Keep all persons out of the path of moving equipment and boards when operating the Conveyor. Failure to do so will result in serious injury.

#### **KEEP HANDS AWAY**

**DANGER!** Moving Parts Can Crush and Cut. Keep hands clear. Make sure all guards and covers are in place and secured before operating or towing. Failure to do so may result in serious injury.

**DANGER!** Always be aware of and take proper protective measures against rotating shafts, pulleys, sprockets, etc. Always stay a safe distance from rotating members and make sure that loose clothing or long hair does not engage rotating members resulting in possible injury.





WARNING! Coastdown Required.

Always shut off the motor and allow all moving parts to come to a complete stop before removing any guards or covers. Do NOT operate with any guards or covers removed.

**WARNING!** Kickback Hazard. Stay clear of area during operation. Follow all anti-kickback service and safety rules. Failure to do so may result in serious injury.



#### LOCKOUT MACHINE BEFORE PERFORM-ING SERVICE

Turn off and lockout power to the Edger before servicing the Conveyor. See the lockout procedure provided in your Edger operator's manual.

# USE PROPER PROCEDURE WHEN CONDUCTING ELECTRICAL SAFETY CHECKS AND MAINTENANCE



**DANGER!** Make sure all electrical installation, service and/or maintenance work is performed by a qualified electrician and is in accordance with applicable electrical codes.

**DANGER!** Hazardous voltage inside the electric disconnect box, starter box, and at the motor can cause shock, burns, or death. Disconnect and lock out power supply before servicing! Keep all electrical component covers closed and securely fastened during Conveyor operation.





**WARNING!** Consider all electrical circuits energized and dangerous.

**WARNING!** Never assume or take the word of another person that the power is off; check it out and lock it out.

**WARNING!** Do not wear rings, watches, or other jewelry while working around an open electrical circuit.

#### **DANGER!** Lockout procedures must be used during:

Changing or adjusting blades Unjamming operations Cleaning Mechanical repair Electrical maintenance Retrieval of tools/parts from work area Activities where guards or electrical panel guard is open or removed

#### Maintenance hazards include:

Blade contact Pinch points Kickbacks Missiles (thrown blades/wood chips) Electrical

Failure to lockout may result in:

Cut Crush Blindness Puncture Serious injury and death Amputation Burn Shock Electrocution

#### To control maintenance dangers:

Lockout procedures must be followed (see ANSI Standard Z244.1-1982 and OSHA regulation 1910.147). Never rely on machine stop control for maintenance safety (emergency stops, on/off buttons, interlocks). Do not reach into moving blades or feed systems. Allow all coasting parts to come to a complete stop. Electrical power supply and air supply must both be locked out. Where established lockout procedures cannot be used (electrical troubleshooting or mechanical dynamic troubleshooting), alternative effective protective techniques shall be employed which may require special skills and planning.

Always follow safe operations practices in the workplace.

#### Conveyor LOCKOUT PROCEDURE

Lockout procedures must be followed (see ANSI Standard Z244.1-1982 and OSHA regulation 1910.147).

#### Purpose:

This procedure establishes the minimum requirements for lockout of energy sources that could cause injury.

#### Responsibility:

The responsibility for seeing that this procedure is followed is binding upon all workers. All workers shall be instructed in the safety significance of the lockout procedure. It is your responsibility to ensure safe operation of the machine.

#### Sequence of Lockout Procedure:

- **1.** Notify all persons that a lockout is required and the reason therefore.
- **2.** If the Conveyor is operating, shut it down by the normal stopping procedure.
- **3.** Operate the switch (located on the edger control box) so that the energy sources are disconnected or isolated from the Conveyor. Stored energy such as moving blades and feed system shall be dissipated.
- **4.** Lockout the energy isolating devices with assigned individual locks.
- **5.** After ensuring that no persons are exposed and as a check on having disconnected the energy sources, operate the push button or other normal operating controls to make certain the Conveyor will not operate. Caution: Return operating controls to neutral position

after the test.

6. The Conveyor is now locked out.

#### **Restoring Equipment to Service**

- 1. When the job is complete and the Conveyor is ready for testing or normal service, check the Conveyor area to see that no one is exposed.
- **2.** When the Conveyor is all clear, remove all locks. The energy isolating devices may be operated to restore energy to the Conveyor.

#### Procedure Involving More Than One Person

In the preceding steps, if more than one individual is required to lock out the Conveyor, each shall place his own personal lock on the energy isolating devices.

#### Rules for Using Lockout Procedure

The Conveyor shall be locked out to protect against accidental or inadvertent operation when such operation could cause injury to personnel. Do not attempt to operate any switch or valve bearing a lock.

#### Owner's Responsibility

The procedures listed in this manual may not include all ANSI, OSHA, or locally required safety procedures. It is the owner/operator's responsibility and not AWMV Products to ensure all operators are properly trained and informed of all safety protocols. Owner/Operators are responsible for following all safety procedures when operating and performing maintenance to the Conveyor.

# SECTION 3 SETUP AND OPERATION

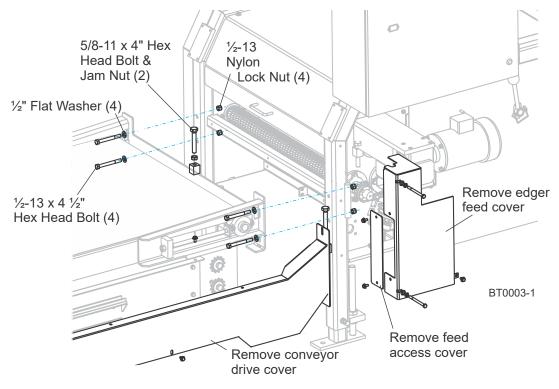
### 3.1 Setup

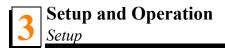
Use a forklift or other appropriate equipment to move the conveyor.

WARNING! Use extreme care and proper equipment to lift and move the conveyor. Lift under the base of the machine only. Failure to do so may result in personal injury and/or machine damage.

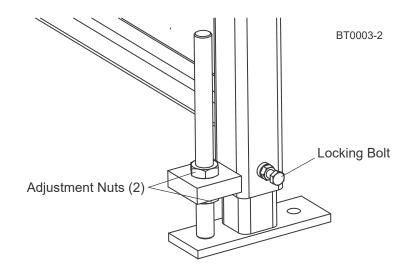
Place the conveyor on a concrete foundation strong enough to support the weight of the machine. Allow for room around the unit.

**See Figure 3-1.** Remove the edger feed cover and disassemble the feed access cover from the feed cover. Remove the conveyor drive cover. Position the conveyor on the outfeed side of the edger. Install the provided  $5/8-11 \times 4$ " bolts and jam nuts to the threaded blocks on the edger frame. **NOTE:** Insert the bolts through the slots in the conveyor frame before installing the conveyor to the edger. Rest the conveyor frame on the bolts and adjust the bolts up or down to position the conveyor belt 1 - 2" lower than the upper edge of the edger outfeed rollers to allow for a slight drop of boards from the edger. Secure the conveyor to the edger frame using four  $1/2-13 \times 4 1/2$ " hex head bolts, flat washers and nylon lock nuts.





**See Figure 3-2.** Adjust the conveyor legs so the feet firmly contact the ground. Loosen the locking bolt. Turn the adjustment nuts counterclockwise to raise the conveyor, turn the adjustment nuts clockwise to lower the conveyor. Make sure the unit is level before securing.





Tighten the adjustment nuts when the height adjustment is complete. Secure the leg with the locking bolt. Secure the conveyor to the foundation with anchor bolts.

**See Figure 3-3.** Install the provided sprocket to the edger feed shaft. Secure the sprocket to the feed shaft by tightening the sprocket set screw. Install the conveyor drive chain around the sprockets on the conveyor and edger as shown below. Turn the nuts on the idler sprocket adjustment rod to adjust the idler sprocket until it engages the chain (<u>See Section 4.2</u>). Retighten the adjustment rod nuts.

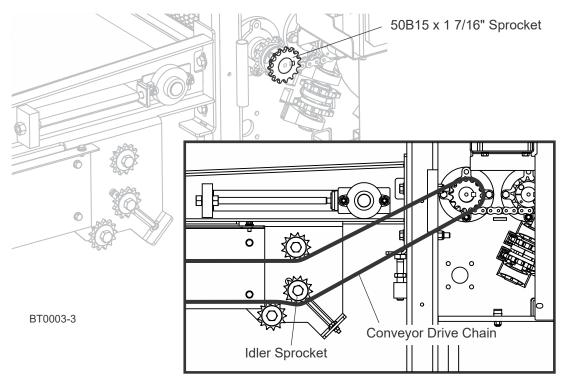

# 3.2 Starting And Stopping The Machine

**DANGER!** Make sure all guards and covers are in place and secured before operating the conveyor. Failure to do so may result in serious injury.

**DANGER!** Always be sure all persons are away from the conveyor before starting the edger motor. Failure to do so will result in serious injury.



**WARNING!** Always wear eye, ear, respiration, and foot protection when operating the conveyor. Failure to do so may result in serious injury.

- **1.** If necessary, release the E-STOP button on the edger control box by turning it clockwise until it pops out.
- To start the conveyor, push the green MACHINE-START button on the edger control box.
   NOTE: The conveyor operates whenever the Edger feed system is activated. See the Edger operator's manual for feed system operation instructions.

**NOTE:** The covers and the electrical cabinet must be closed before the edger can be started.

The emergency switches on the edger electrical box can also be used to shutdown the conveyor.

**3.** Push the E-STOP button on the edger control box in an emergency to stop the conveyor drive chain. This button must be released by turning clockwise before the conveyor can be restarted. **IMPORTANT:** The E-STOP button shuts down both the conveyor and the edger at the same time.

# SECTION 4 MAINTENANCE

**DANGER!** Always turn off and disconnect power supply before performing any service to the machine. Failure to do so may result in serious injury or death.

### 4.1 Belt Tension and Alignment

Adjust the conveyor belt tension as needed. To adjust, locate the adjustment bolts at the front of the conveyor on both sides of the frame. Use the adjustment bolts to adjust the belt tension until the center of the belt can be deflected approx. 2" - 3" (50 - 75mm). Secure the adjustment bolts with the locking nuts when the belt tensioning is complete.

#### See Figure 4-1.

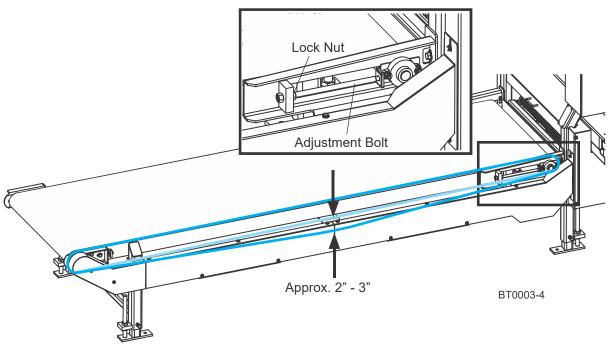

**CAUTION!** Do not over-tension the conveyor belt. Over-tensioning the belt will result in premature belt failure.

Periodically check the conveyor belt for wear. Replace a damaged or worn belt as needed. Always check the conveyor belt alignment after installing a new belt. Align the conveyor belt as described below, if necessary.

The conveyor is factory-aligned. Periodically check and realign the conveyor belt if necessary. Make sure the belt remains centered on the rollers while running. If the conveyor belt keeps traveling to one of the sides, follow the realignment procedure below.

To realign the conveyor belt:

1. Loosen the lock nut on the alignment bolt on one or both sides of the frame.

#### See Figure 4-2.

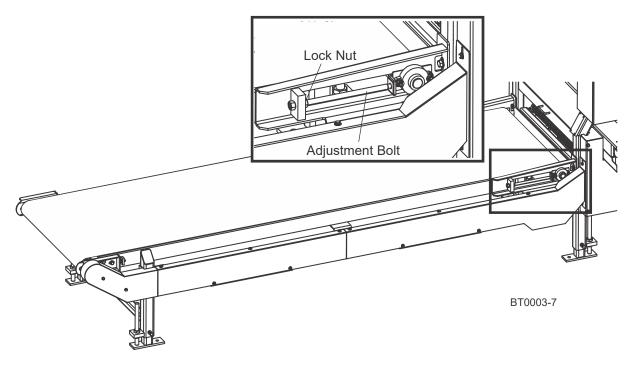

- 2. Turn one of the alignment bolts to move the belt roller as necessary.
- **3.** Start the edger and the conveyor to check if the conveyor belt still needs to be aligned. Repeat the steps until the conveyor belt stays in place on the rollers while running.
- **4.** Tighten the lock nuts on the alignment bolts when the belt alignment procedure is complete.

### 4.2 Drive Chain Tension

**See Figure 4-3.** The drive chain tension can be adjusted with the adjustable idler sprocket. To adjust the chain tension, remove the conveyor drive chain cover to access the adjustable idler sprocket. To tension the chain, turn the nuts on the threaded adjustment rod to pull the idler sprocket toward the chain.

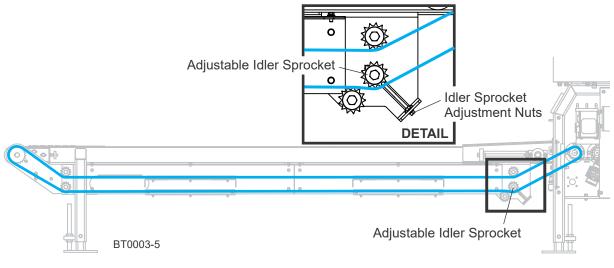
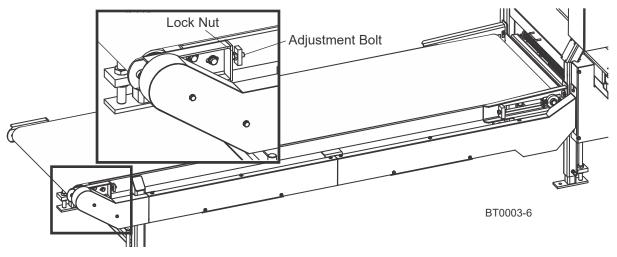

**See Figure 4-4.** The drive chain and belt tension can also be adjusted using the adjustment bolts at the rear of the conveyor belt. Secure the adjustment bolts with the lock nuts when the chain/belt tensioning is complete.







# 4.3 Lubrication

- **1.** Lubricate the belt and chain sprocket bearings every 200 hours of operation with one to
- <sup>200</sup> two pumps of lithium-based grease such as Shell Alvania No. 3. Do not overgrease.
